<p>Elisa Loncón - Indigenous, President of the Convention, Representative of the Mapuche People</p>	<p>An academic born into poverty, she is a fierce advocate for indigenous rights and the teaching of the Mapuche language, and won election to the presidency through a campaign for gender equality, pluralism, and indigenous representation.</p>
<p>Luis Alejandro Abel Mayol Bouchon - Vamos por Chile, Representative of the 23rd District</p>	<p>A prominent businessman formerly involved with Sebastian Piñera's presidency, he is an opponent of plurinationalism and has expressed support for socially conservative and environmentalist policies.</p>
<p>Gabriel Boric - Apruebo Dignidad, President of Chile</p>	<p>Originally a student leader, he was instrumental in passing the referendum calling for a constitutional convention in response to the 2019 protests. A socialistic opponent of neoliberalism willing to adopt more moderate positions for political progress, Boric hopes the new constitution can provide a better alternative to Chile's continuing "transition to democracy."</p>
<p>Francisca Linconao - Indigenous, Representative of the Mapuche People</p>	<p>A longtime defender of indigenous people and a spiritual leader within the Mapuche Community, she will focus on advocating for indigenous rights in the new constitution.</p>
<p>Jorge Arancibia - Vamos por Chile, Representative of the 7th District</p>	<p>A former aide-de-camp to General Pinochet and current lawyer who has defended the regime's attitude towards human rights, he advocates for the modernization of state bureaucracies, parental rights, and military strength.</p>
<p>Francisco Caamaño Rojas - Lista del Pueblo, Representative of the 14th District</p>	<p>An engineer and politician, he prioritized education, environmental protection, freedom of the press, and personal privacy rights. He also places a strong emphasis on civic participation, indicating support for citizens to introduce legislation.</p>
<p>Fernando Atria - Apruebo Dignidad, Representative of the 10th District</p>	<p>A lawyer, and university professor, he became known as "El Mostrador" for his leading role in the 2011 student protests. He emphasizes education, land reform, and human rights protection.</p>

Patricia Politzer - Independientes no Neutrales, Representative of the 10th District	A journalist and writer, she served as Director of Communication of the Ministry General Secretariat of the Presidency. She focuses on the importance of media transparency as well as citizen participation and balance of power.
Teresa Marinovic - Vamos por Chile, Representative of the 10th District	A conservative journalist considered a leader in the center-right movement, she is known for her outspoken and confrontational approach to politics and her advocacy for conservative social policies.
Jamie Bassa - Apruebo Dignidad, Vice President of the Convention, Representative of District 7	A politician and attorney, he is an advocate for economic interventionism and has heavily criticized economic inequality within Chile.
Renato Garín - Lista del Apruebo, Representative of the 14th District	A politician and former Congressman, Garín prioritizes ownership of water basins and ensuring the balance of power within the government.
Gaspar Dominguez - Independientes no Neutrales, Representative of the 26th District	A doctor and member of the LGBT community, he advocates for health care reform, specifically a single-payer universal system, and wants to build consensus on the constitution within the convention.
Hernán Larraín Matte - Vamos por Chile, Representative of the 11th District	A former presidential advisor for Sebastian Piñera, he has advocated for civil rights while respecting the private sector, and has stressed the importance of property rights in the new constitution.
Margarita Vargas López - Indigenous, Representative of the Kawésqar People	A social activist, academic, and writer, she has emphasized the need for gender parity and self-determination for indigenous peoples.
Hugo Humberto Gutierrez Galvez - Apruebo Dignidad, Representative of the 2nd District	A communist politician and lawyer who worked against Pinochet's military regime in the 1980's, he has focused on ensuring that left-wing groups have a place in Chilean politics free from oppression.
Tania Madriaga - Lista del Pueblo, Representative of the 7th District	A sociologist and academic, she strongly supports a more decentralized government and commitment to a parliamentary legislature.
Cristian Viera Alvarez - Lista del Apruebo, Representative of the 17th District	A constitutional law professor and a prominent lawyer, he strongly believes in public participation in the making of a constitution and emphasizes social rights as the foundation of government.
Miguel Ángel Botto - Independientes no Neutrales, Representative of the 6th District	An academic and entrepreneur, he believes in transitioning Chile to a plurinational, decentralized state, as well as water rights, gender equality, and equitable development.

Cristobal Andrade - Lista del Pueblo, Representative of the 6th District	A teacher and automotive mechanic, he garnered national attention with his blue Tyrannosaurus Rex costume. He advocated for gender equality, respect for indigenous peoples, and minority protection.
Malucha Pinto - Lista del Apruebo, Representative of the 13th District	An actress, theater director, and playwright, they used their fame to criticize the military police abuses of rights during the 2019 protests. They prioritize democracy, women's rights, and human rights.
Marco Arellano - Lista del Pueblo, Representative of the 8th District	A lawyer and civil servant, he supports criminal law reform, civil rights, and citizen involvement in politics.
Maria Rivera - Lista del Pueblo, Representative of the 8th District	A Trotskyist lawyer, she heavily criticized President Piñera's treatment of political prisoners during the 2019 protests.
Constanza Hube - Vamos por Chile, Representative of the 11th District	A constitutional lawyer, she emphasizes religious freedom, neoliberal economics, and limited government.
Javier Fuchslocher - Independientes no Neutrales, Representative of the 21st District	An openly gay history professor, he prioritizes representation of the lower middle class and sexually diverse individuals in the convention, as well as equal rights.
Isabel Godoy - Indigenous, Representative of the Colla People	An indigenous activist and former political prisoner during the military dictatorship, she has advocated for the protection of natural resources and the right to water.
Maximiliano Hurtado - Lista del Apruebo, Representative of the 4th District	A lawyer and senatorial aide, he focuses on citizen participation and government as well as social welfare issues like education, housing, and public health.
Pollyana Rivera - Vamos por Chile, Representative of the 1st District	A prominent right wing journalist, she believes in parental rights in education, cultural homogeneity, and personal property rights.
Valentina Miranda - Apruebo Dignidad, Representative of the 8th District	A political activist and the youngest member of the convention, she focuses on advocating for indigenous rights, gender parity, and environmental issues.
Maria Trinidad Castillo - Independientes no Neutrales, Representative of the 5th District	A professor of biology, she focuses on education as well as a broad range of issues such as equal pensions and sustainability.
